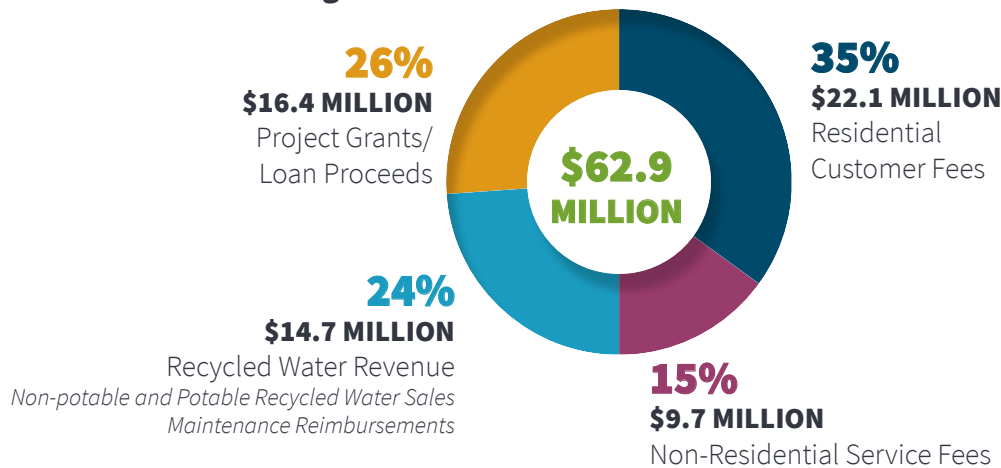

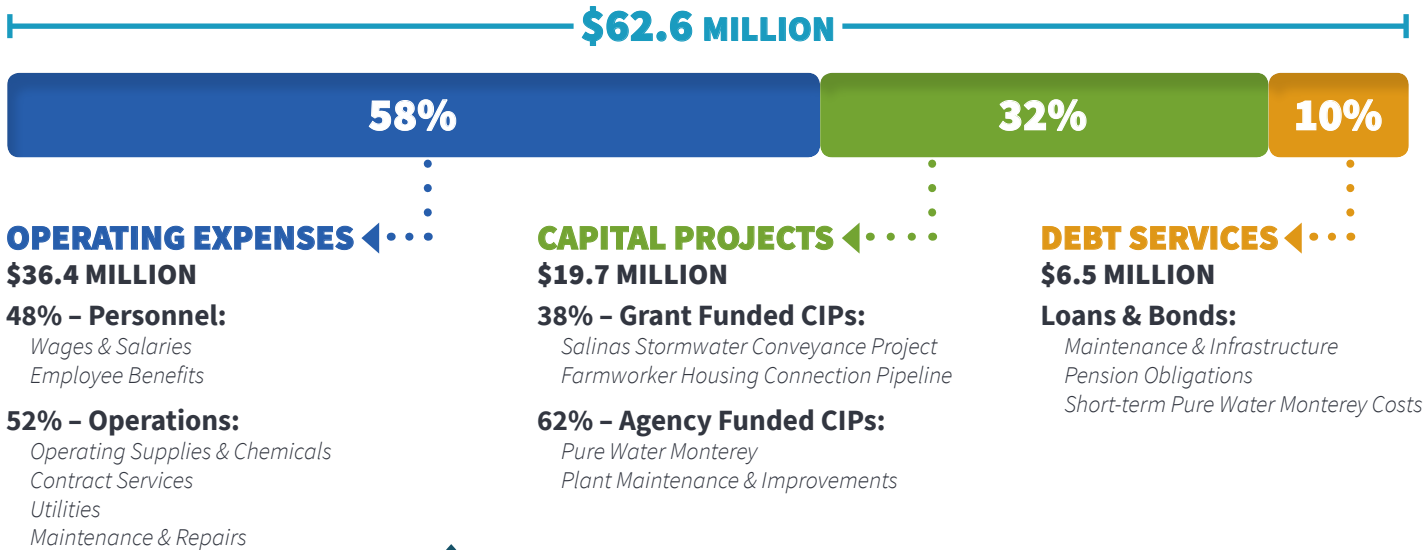

A Groundwater Replenishment Project

Using a proven, multi-stage purification process, Pure Water Monterey will turn used water into a safe, reliable, and sustainable water supply that complies with or exceeds strict state and federal drinking water standards. The project is under construction and estimated to start producing water in late 2019.
