Dear Mr. Malais:

We have completed our review of the *Monterey One Water Annex* to the *2015 Monterey County Multi-Jurisdiction Hazard Mitigation Plan* and have found the amended plan to continue to be in conformance with Title 44 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 201.6 *Local Hazard Mitigation Plans*.

FEMA's approval of the *2015 Monterey County Multi-Jurisdiction Hazard Mitigation Plan* remains for a period of five years from the original approval date of March 7, 2016 for all approved participants, which now includes Monterey One Water. This plan amendment will not alter the approval date that had originally been established. An updated list of the current status of participating jurisdictions is enclosed with this letter.

Prior to March 7, 2021, Monterey County and all participating jurisdictions are required to review and revise the plan to reflect changes in development, progress in local mitigation efforts, and changes in priorities, and resubmit it for approval in order to continue to be eligible for mitigation project grant funding.

The continued approval of this plan ensures the Monterey County and all participating jurisdictions' continued eligibility for project grants under FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Assistance programs, including the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, Pre-Disaster Mitigation Program, and Flood Mitigation Assistance Program. All requests for funding, however, will be evaluated individually according to the specific eligibility, and other requirements of the particular program under which applications are submitted.

RESOLUTION NO. 2018-05
A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF
MONTEREY ONE WATER ADOPTING THE
MONTEREY COUNTY MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL HAZARD
MITIGATION PLAN

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WHEREAS, the Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 requires all cities, counties, and special districts to have adopted a Local Hazard Mitigation Plan to receive disaster mitigation funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA); and

WHEREAS, the Monterey One Water (M1W, formerly Monterey Regional Water Pollution Control Agency) service area is subject to various hazards, natural and human-influenced; and

WHEREAS, M1W recognizes that disasters do not adhere to City, County or Special District boundaries; and

WHEREAS, M1W has a mission to reduce the vulnerability of the Agency and its member entities to the effects of natural hazards through the effective use of risk assessments, management approaches, and coordination with State, regional, and local hazard mitigation plans; and

WHEREAS, to accomplish this mission, M1W has set the following goals: identify and profile hazards; assess vulnerability; set hazard mitigation goals and strategy; leverage Agency hazard mitigation resources and information with those of other local entities; and

WHEREAS, to realize these goals, M1W has surveyed existing data; utilized expertise from Agency personnel; and compiled an appendix to the comprehensive Monterey County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan ("County Plan"); and

WHEREAS, M1W has obtained written approval from FEMA and the County of Monterey Office of Emergency Services (OES) to join the County Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of Monterey One Water, as follows:

1. M1W adopts the Monterey County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan as its own; and
2. M1W commits to continuing to take actions and initiate further actions as appropriate, as identified in the Monterey County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan, including maintenance of M1W's appendix and active participation in future County Plan updates.
